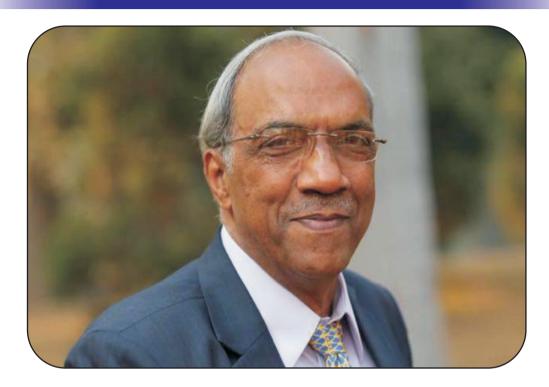

CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS

K. L. Mehta Dayanand College for Women, Faridabad is one of the Premier women educational institution. It was established in 1970, celebrating its 50th year named after its founder Sh. K.L. Mehta, a dedicated social activist and staunch Arya Samajist. The College is run through Maharishi Dayanand Educational Society - A beacon light for spreading of education in Faridabad. The College has become the pride in the field of girls education.

The College imparts education in the faculties of Arts, Science, B.Sc, (Medical, Non-Medical / Hm. Sc. & Biotech) and Commerce and Management. In order to meet the cherished desires of the girl students for attaining higher and more meaningful educational qualifications various courses viz, M.Com, M.A. (Eco), M.Sc. Computer Sc, M.A. Pol. Sc., M.Sc. (Chemistry), M.Sc. (Mathematics) B.B.A, BCA, B.Com (H), B.Com (CA), B.Sc. Biotech.were initiated. The College is running various Add-on courses, *i.e.*, Fashion Designing, Early Child Care & Education, Accounting on computer, three NSDC courses, two NIIT Courses and PO Coaching Classes for the benefit of students.

To provide facilities to the students we have sprawling campus of 5.5 acre land, lush green play grounds, botanical garden, Basket ball & Volleyball court, Cricket pitch, Yoga and judo rooms, common room, auditorium, canteen, seminar hall. INFRASTRUCTURE

The College has a state-of-the-art infrastructure. The iconic academic building has been designed for channelising positive energies throughout, defining importance of open space. The infrastructure also includes a state of the art auditorium, with a capacity of 700 students. Apart from this, the infrastructure includes aesthetically designed class rooms to provide a stimulating atmosphere conducive to all-round development of the students. The college has 8 fully air-conditioned, Information technology labs with internet connectivity. We have well stocked medical room. We have also been in touch with local hospital for having medical check-up and consultation fOEphysical fitness of our student and faculty. The institution has a sports centre with a host of indoor and outdoor games such as Table Tennis, Chess, Carrom, Archery etc. Our institution has sprawling sports infrastructure. Many University, Inter and intra college tournaments are organized in our Basket Ball court. Our playground is also a pride for entire district, as many competitions of external institution and agencies are organized here. For health conscious students and staff our yoga teacher and gym instructor are always on the job. The institution has a modern canteen which offers hygienic, wholesome and nutritious food at subsidized rates. Variety of snacks and meals are served in neat and clean surroundings. The library plays a pivotal role in the learning activities of the students. With this consideration our library acts as an important learning resource centre. It has infilbnet factility. We have a digital library with a comprehensive collection of latest books, E-books, journals, E-journals and magazines. The college also has book bank facility to cater to the needs of poor students. The institution has a well maintained & spacious Yagyashala to inculcate the traditional Indian values among the students. Our new session commences with Yagya moreover Yagya is performed on all important occasions. To provide practical knowledge, the college has 13 specialised labs viz Physics, Chemistry, Bio-Technology, Botany, Zoology, Food and Nutrition, Home-Management, Clothing and Textile, Music and English language lab. The institution also boasts of a modern well equipped Seminar Hall with a capacity of 200 students. It is used regularly to hold seminars and training sessions for the students. Wehave two spacious common rooms for the students to relax and play indoor games in their free time. The infrastructure keeps on augumenting as per the increasing strength of students.



BEYOND THE CURRICULUM

1. Sports

Besides academics, it is also important to develop team spirit and sportsmanship among students, through participation in various sports events. Keeping this in mind, we encourage our students to participate in both outdoor and indoor games at University, district, state and national level. Our students have won laurels in games like yoga, basket ball, soft ball, cricket, baseball, taekwondo, carrom, Archery, Athletics, Kabaddai etc.

2. Cultural

The aim of education is to convert the mind into a living fountain and not a reservoir. Hence our college ensures that besides effective and proper imparting of subject knowledge students should evince keen interest in co-curricular activities. In the Zonal Youth Festival our college won several prizes.

3. Literary Societies

The college has a network of subject societies which provide a forum to the students to unfold their latent talent and serve as a platform for developing creative temper English, Hindi & Sanskrit, Literary Society organize various programmes to refurbish the knowledge of students. Essay-writing, Recitation, Paper reading, Quiz, Story writing, Shalok Uccharan and many more educative competitions are regular, features of Literary Societies, Hindi Literary Society celebrates "Hind Diwas", Students also parivate and win prizes in Inter College Competitions.

4. Social Science forum

Social Science forum comprising of political Science, Sociology, History and economics. Department organized general thought provoking and educative congregation for developing in-depth knowledge of their respective students Various Competitions like quiz Competition, Speech, PPT Presentation and extempore Competitions are organized on current topics.

5. Commerce & Management Studies Department

The students are provided with multiple opportunities to attend and participate in Lectures, Seminars and Workshops, conducted by faculty, from renowned institutions. Keeping in view our objective of nurturing future managers, we also hold various inter and intra college competitions like Power Point Presentation, admad show, professional Ramp walking etc.

6. Science and Home Science

Science and Home Science department of our college holds many Intra College and Inter college competitions. Among these are poster making, Collage making, Mehandi, Rangoli, Nutritious recipe contest, embroidery, Thali decoration, Display board, Model Making, (Working and Non-Working), Paper Reading, debate etc. Every year we organise K.L. Mehta Memorial Inter College Science and Home Science Competitions to commemorate our founder Late Sh. K.L. Mehtaji. Inter College Science Ouiz is one of the important activities of this competition.



Further our students have also won prizes in essay writing and many other activities at District and State levels. Students have also been taken for visits to cottage emporium, Dilli-haat and Botanical garden to have first hand knowledge.

7. NSS

NSS plays a vital role to channelize the youthful energies of the students for constructive social work. We have two units of NSS in our College. Students NSS celebrate important days with enthusiasm. they also contribute towards their social responsibility by participating in Pulse Polio Programme, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and B . Bac ao Beti Padao Programme initiated by our worthly Prime Minister. A special camp for 7 days and night is being conducted by both NSS units.

8. Youth Red Cross

The College has "Youth Red Cross Society". The main objective of "Youth Red Cross is to promote Health and Hygiene consciousness in the students. It celebrates various Important Days like World Health Day, World Red Cross Day, All India Blood Donation Day, Anti Drug Day, AIDS Divas etc. A five day (First Aid) Training Camp is organized by The "Red Cross" to empower students to give First Aid in case of emergency. 9. Women Cell & Anti Sexual Harassment Cell

Being a women's institution, women cell in our college has striven to awaken the girls by enlightening them regarding gender bias persisting in our Indian society till date. 12. Legal Literacy Cell

ADMISSIONIMPORTANT NOTICE

Candidates seeking admission must fulfill the eligibility conditions recommended by University, of the particular class. The college will not be responsible if the admission of any student is not confirmed by M.D. University Rohtak.

The Principal reserves the right not to grant admission to any students without assigning any reason. in interest of the discipline of the college.

It is compulsory for all students to get their identity cards issued from the library on scheduled dates.

Students admission will be done online on Government Portal.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWL

If a candidate after having been admitted to the Ist year of course, leaves the course without attending any class and she applies for refund of fee within 7 days of the date of admission, the fee paid by her shall be refunded after deducting Rs. 1000/-

If a candidate after having been admitted to the first year of a course withdraws her candidature after 7 days and the seat vacated by her is subsequently filled up from the waiting list, the fee paid by her shall be refunded after deducting 15% of the fee paid by her subject to a minium of Rs. 1000/-

In a similar case if the seat vacated by a candidate is not filled up, the fee paid her would not be refunded.

(ii) In case of seats remaining vacant after 15th July, 2019, the late admission may be allowed on merit basis by the Principal/Director concerned with a late fee as under:-

16 July 2019 to 24 July 2019 ₹ 100/25 July 2019 to 31 July 2019 ₹ 200/01 August 2019 to 08 August 2019 ₹ 500/09 August 2019 to 15 August 2019 ₹ 1000/16 August 2019 to 22 August 2019 ₹ 2000/- (with the permission of Vice-Chancellor)

However, in the case, of extreme hardship Vice-Chancellor may allow condone the delay for admission after 22 August 2019 with admissible late fee.

The list of students so admitted be sent alongwith Registration Return.

- (iii) Candidates who have compartment/re-appear in one or more paper(s) in the qualifying examinations shall not be allowed admission in 1st semester of the course in any case.
- (iv) There will be no admission by the College/Institute after the above schedule in order to maintain the 'statutory provision of clear 90 teaching days per semester. If the number of teaching days falls short due to some unforeseen reasons, it shall be the responsibility of the Principal/Director and the concerned teacher to make good the loss by taking extra classes.
- (v) The admission for promoted students be made by 15th July, 2019 positively. Thereafter, the admission will be made with late fee as above. The late fee so charged from the students by the Colleges/Institutes shall be remitted to the University alongwith Continuation Return.
- (vi) The Institutes/Gurukuls running OT/MIL Courses shall seek the approval of the University for admission schedule for these courses.

Best of top 5 subjects shall be taken into account for merit purpose in admission provided that the student shall have the required compulsory subjects in 10+2 for becoming eligible for admission in particular stream / course as per minimum requirements for a subject course as notified by the affiliating university, *i.e.*, the student shall have passed in PCB/PCM and language in 10+2 for Non-medical/Medical streams, pass in subject viz. Maths for Hons Course in Maths.

Eligibility Conditions For Admission for PG Classes

Master of Political Science M.A (Pol. Sc.)

- 1. Candidates who have passed B.A Pol Sc. (Hons)
- 2. Candidates who have passed B.A (Hons) With 50% marks
- 3. Candidates who have passed B.A (Pass) With 50% marks & secured 45% marks in political Science.
- 4. The above courses must have been passed either from M.D.U. Rohtak or any other university recognised as equivalent thereto.
- 5. Candidates who have passed the degree Course with public administration or Sociology with 45% marks in aggregate

Master of Commerce (M. Com)

The candidates who have passed B.Com. or B.A with Economics as subject or B.A with Commerce / Marketing / Insurance as subject (with 45% marks in the paper of Economics / Commerce / Marketing / Insurance) from M.D.U. Rohtak or any other university recognised as equivalent thereto with English as one of the subjects and 45% marks in aggregate.

Master of Economics M.A (Economics)

The basic eligibility criterion for pursuing M.A (Economics) degree is having graduation degree in B.A, B.A.(Hons), B.Com and B.Com (Hons)

Minimum eligibility for M.A (Economics) is 50% marks in graduation in aggregate and more than 55% marks in Economics Subject.

The above course must have done either from M.D.U. Rohtak or any other recognised university.

Master of Science (Chemistry)

BSc. (Hons) in chemistry / B.Sc. (Pass)with chemistry as one of the main subjects with atleast 50% marks in aggregate or any examination recognised by M.D. University, Rohtak or any other university recognised as equivalent thereto.

Master of Science (Mathematics)

B.A/B.Sc. (Hons) in Mathematics / B.A or B.Sc. (Pass) with Mathematics as one of the main subject with atleast 50% marks in aggregate or any examination recognised by M.D. University, Rohtak or any other university recognised as equivalent thereto.

Admission to above courses will be made by the college itself on the basis of the merit of the qualifying examination.

LIBRARY

The college has a prestigious computerized library, fully automated, through TechLib software. Two computers are equipped with internet facility so that the Professors and students may have access to electronic archives *i.e.* (e-books and e-journals) from the college premises which is provided by K.L. Mehta Dayanand college for women. Students can access library resources through their smart devices. The library provides INFLIBNET facility to all users.

Rules

- 1. Library/Reading room will remain open from 9.00 a.m to 4.00 p.m. on all working days. The time period for issue and return of books is 15 days.
- 2. All bonafide students are enrolled as members of the library. The students must bring the college bar coded identity card in the library. The college ID card will be used as Library membership card also.
- 3. The Library provides books to the needy students on long term basis. Please contact the library for details.
- 4. A student has to show her identity card at the circulation desk each time whether to borrow or return the book.
- 5. Multi Volume/Rare Books encyclopedia & dictionaries are kept in REFERENCE SECTION and stamped "NOT TO BE ISSUED." These books are for reference only and strictly not to be issued.
- 6. At any time issued books may be recalled by the library.
- 7. The Loan Period may be on the other hand be extended if the book is not otherwise in demand.
- 8. A member shall ensure that the books lent to her is in good condition before leaving the issue counter. She must ensure that the pages are intact. If the pages are missing, she must bring it to notice of the person on duty. Marking on the books is prohibited.
- 9. Students will have to replace the damaged/torn books or to pay penal compensation if the book is not available in the market.
- 10. All issued books should be returned on the due date. A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged from the students for late return of book. In case a student does not return the book even one week after the due date, the library facility may be withdrawn. If the damaged/lost book is part of multi volume Set the whole set has to be replaced.
- 11. Loss/mutilation of Bar Coded ID-card is to be reported immediately to the librarian. Duplicate barcoded Id-Card Will be issued on payments of Rs. 200/- per card within a month time from the date of report.
- 12. Bar Code Id Cards are NOT TRANSFERABLE. as they are token of a privilege which only the members to whom they are issued are entitled to. The member, however continues to be responsible for any loss which the library may suffer through the loss or misuse of her lost card.
- 13. Talking on the Mobile phone is prohibited in the library. Members are requested to maintain norms of discipline, keep library property and furniture in good condition and maintain SILENCE and cleanliness.
- 14. Any suggestion for improving the library services will be appreciated. The library seeks Co-operation in the observance of the rules and trusts that you will co-operate fully.



CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. It is mandatory for the students to carry their ID card daily & must wear it.
